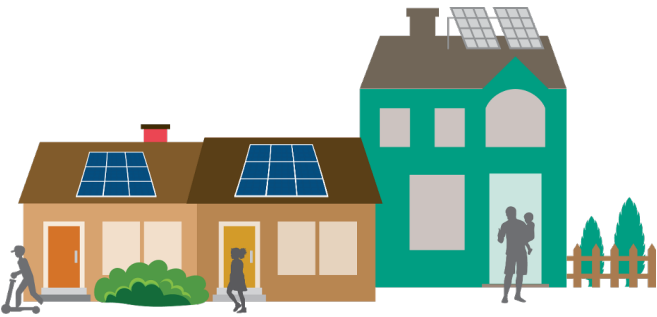

Smart-E Loans offer no money down, low interest financing with flexible terms to help you upgrade your home's energy performance or sustainability.
